Start talking.

Start thinking.

- Why was Passover an appropriate time for the events of vv1-5 to unfold? Why is it risky?
- What is significant about the setting for tis woman's gift to Jesus?
- What's the context in Jesus' life that justifies this gift (vv11-12)?
- · Why do you think the disciples got upset with the gift?
- · What is Jesus trying to teach his disciples about priorities?
- How does this scene relate to what happens in vv14-16?

Start sharing.

- What "beautiful" thing could you do this week for Jesus (or the least of these)?
- Whereas the woman gave lavishly for Jesus, Judas wanted to see what he could get from him. In what ways are you like the woman? Like Judas?

Start praying. Be bold and pray with power.
