Start talking.

 As a kid, what was your favorite pet? How did this pet respond when it heard your voice?

Start thinking.

- What do the sheep, shepherd, and stranger represent?
 How does the story in chapter 9 provide one example of what this parable is about?
- What is the relationship of the shepherd to his sheep?
 How do the sheep respond to the shepherd? How does this relate to the Pharisees' difficulty in understanding Jesus?
- How does Jesus identify himself with the "good shepherd" (vv.11-15)? How does Jesus' death relate to his promise in verse 10?
- Who are the "other sheep" he must bring also? What characterizes his flock?
- What final claim does Jesus make (vv. 17-18)? Why do his listeners respond as they do? How would you have responded?

Start sharing.

- What turning point was significant for you in terms of hearing "God's voice" and responding?
- How do you discern his voice from those of so many others that vie for your attention?

Start praying. Be bold and pray with power.

God, often I admit that I want to just trust in what I can see and am often can be in too much of a hurry to truly listen. Help me to slow down enough to pay attention to what you have to say. Help me to be patient and trust in each step. May I be found faithful as I point to you in every area of my life.

Start Doing:
