Start talking.

 - How do David's words express both longing and strength?

 - What role did shouting or loud praise play in these moments?
 - What do these examples teach us about unified worship?

Start sharing.

- Have you ever experienced comfort or healing during a loud or communal worship moment?
- Why do you think hearing others praise God can be healing even when we're struggling?
- How does this reframe how we view singing in church?
- What connection do you feel between earthly worship and the worship described in Revelation 5?
- In what ways does worship prepare or equip you for spiritual battles in your daily life?
- How might shouting or loud praise be an act of spiritual resistance?

Start praying. Be bold and pray with power.

Thank you, Father, for all the daily blessings and provisions that You have given to us. Father, open our eyes to the many wondrous works which You have accomplished for all of us. You provide the food we eat, the shelter we inhabit. You provide the air we breathe and You alone give us life each day.

Start Doing. Commit to a step and live it out this week

1. One generation shall praise (*shabach*) Your works to another..." (Psalm 145:4)
 - How are you intentionally sharing your praise or testimony with the next generation?
 - What might it look like to "*shabach*" in your home, workplace, or community?
